COMMENTS FROM THE STAFF – N. Cherry stated that at the next Supervisors meeting there will be a conditional use hearing prior, due to advertising requirements it didn't make it in time for this meeting but has already been to the Planning Commission with a favorable recommendation outcome. She also mentioned another conditional use that was just filed that will be heard in September and there are two upcoming Zoning Hearing Boards, one tomorrow evening and on September 1st.

PUBLIC COMMENT– Wilbur Nass is requesting that the road crew look into trimming the tree limbs that are over hanging the road right of way on Birchdale Dr and Lynmar. When they get weighed down in the winter it has caused them to hang lower and scrape the vehicles when going by. He also asked if there was any update on the Birchdale sewer situation. Supervisor Platz responded that they hadn't heard anything new but the Water and Sewer Authority would know more where it stands and they meet tomorrow evening. Wilbur Nass also commented that he believes that the project is proceeding in the wrong direction and that the DEP engineers decision should be appealed and a better solution should be sought out. He added that currently the plan for billing is to go to Birchdale residents and expressed that he believes that the entire Township should have to pay for this solution not just the residents in the neighborhood. He also stated that not all the systems are failing and not everyone should be responsible for everyone else's problems.

Motion by C. Brocious, seconded by L. Platz, to adjourn the meeting at 7:10 p.m., motion carried (2-0).
